The annual Strawberry Days celebration takes place the second weekend in June with a parade, carnival rides, games & more. Free strawberries & ice cream are served on Sunday afternoon.



Volga City

Located on the Volga River in the heart of the picturesque Volga Valley, one of the many scenic locations in Northeast Iowa with beautiful views that will take your breath away. Enjoy our City Park and the Volga U Campground. Recreational opportunities offer some of the best small-mouth bass fishing in the area along with canoe and tubing access.

Walking trails wind along the river where eagles, herons, and Canadian geese frequent the river shoreline. Come visit the home of one of Iowa's largest natural white pine groves and view the sculpted limestone cliffs surrounding the river.



Our smaller communities in Clayton County are of interest to visitors.

Clayton: Named after John M. Clayton of the Iowa Legislature, mining was an important aspect of this community's history. Clayton offers visitors beautiful scenery & great sand bars.



Clayton Center: Home of Clayton County's radio station KCTN FM 100.1 and KADR AM 1400.

Froelich: The forerunner of the John Deere tractor invented by John Froelich, rumbled out of this community in 1892.

Elkport: Cast a line & enjoy an afternoon fishing along Elk Creek near the Turkey River.

Farmersburg: Annually hosted "Band Days" during the 1920s & 1930s in the City Park. The historic bandstand still remains.

Garber: This beautiful area houses Plageman's barn, a historical landmark that annually hosts festivals all visitors are sure to appreciate.

Giard: Gold was once found on what is now called "Gold Mine Farm".

Gunder: Take notice of the sundial, carved in recognition of WWI Servicemen & Gunder Branch of the Red Cross. Also be sure to experience the renowned "Gunder Burger".

Littleport: Formerly the rallying ground for Indians of this area, Littleport offers great scenery of the meandering Volga River.

Luana: Home to one of the age-old stone arch bridges of Clayton County. Be sure to stop & relax in the town park or enjoy Luana's ice skating rink.

Mederville: Formerly known as St. John, this community is situated on the south bank of the Volga River, giving visitors access to canoe this scenic river.

Millville: Visit the historic Estes Point where the Turkey & Mississippi rivers meet.

North Buena Vista: Visitors will be amazed by the grotto built into the bluffs surrounding this community.

Osborne: Buildings from this recreated town of yesterday are part of the Iowa Welcome Center, Wildlife Exhibit & Nature Center.

Osterdock: Nestled along the Turkey River Valley, this community is a perfect place to begin a canoe trip.

St. Olaf: Situated in the "Little Switzerland" topography of Northeast Iowa, St. Olaf is home to the "World's Largest Tenderloin."
