

Public & Private Campground Closure Clarification

Governor Kim Reynolds Proclamation on April 6th in regards to Private and Public Campground closures through April 30th was quite clear. After receiving additional questions, the Governor's Office has provided the following information and clarification.

Q: May campgrounds remain open for long-term or permanent tenants who reside at the campground or in order to serve essential employees who wish to self-isolate from family members?

A: Yes. Campgrounds shall be closed to temporary recreational use. The use of the terms "temporary" and "recreational" were intentional as it was not designed to prevent people who reside or serve as campground hosts for the entire summer from having to leave the functional equivalent of their home or to prevent medical professionals or first responders from using campgrounds to self-isolate so as to protect their families. But individuals must reside at the campground; campgrounds must remain closed to individuals who stay at the campground only for a weekend or other short-term stays for recreational purposes, even if they have a season-long lease.
